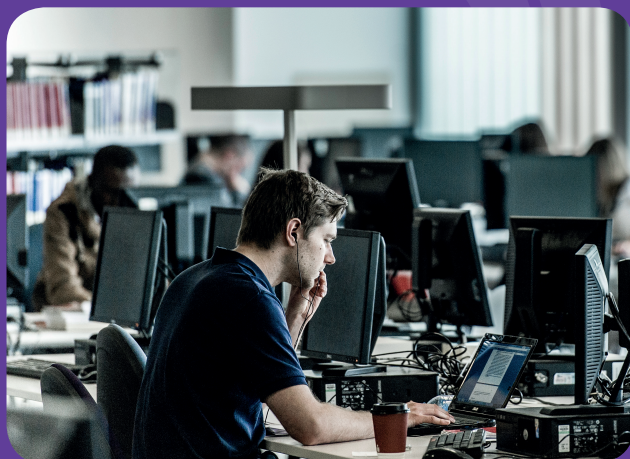
GCU, in partnership with the Glasgow Colleges, offers an alternative route or Pathway into a number of our degrees.

How it works

As a GCU Pathways student you will initially study at a local college, providing a transitional step between where you currently study and University. On successful completion of your HNC or HND, you will then move to GCU to continue your studies. And at the end of fourth or fifth year, you will graduate with a BA, BSc or MEng (Hons) from GCU - it is simply another route.

You will be a part of the GCU community from the beginning of your studies and will be able to access all of GCU's support facilities on campus such as the library and Students' Association.

*You must achieve the entry requirements set for the programme you wish to study to secure your place in 3rd year.

How do I apply?

Applications to GCU Pathways are made through UCAS. How you apply depends on whether you have already made a UCAS application for 2019 entry.

- If you have not yet submitted an application through UCAS Apply 2019 you can apply using the online at www.ucas.com
- If you have already applied through UCAS, but not yet used all 5 choices, you can add one of the programmes above as a late choice.
- If you used all five choices on your UCAS application and have either been unsuccessful in your applications or aren't holding any offers, you can apply through UCAS Extra. This is a free service – available for you to apply to one course at a time between 25 February and 4 July. If Extra is available to you, it'll show up as a button when you sign in to track your application on the UCAS site.

Our admissions team are also on hand to answer any questions you have.

When do I find out if my application has been successful?

Once you submit your application to UCAS, you will receive an email from them confirming that your application has been sent to us. This email will also contain your Personal ID, which will enable you to log in to UCAS Track to check the progress of your application.

When do I start my course?

If successful in your application, you will begin your studies in August.
